Academy History

Burlington Christian Academy (BCA) was established in 1978, and is conveniently located in central North Carolina, between Greensboro and Durham. BCA is the largest non-public school in Alamance County. Academy enrollment is composed of 952 students from Alamance County and seven surrounding counties in grades PK-12. Diversity is notable, as we serve students from every socio-economic background, in addition to international students. The class of 2010 was the first graduating class from Burlington Christian Academy's high school, which is now in its twentieth year, serving an enrollment of 199 students. The academy is accredited by both AdvancED / Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, and the Association of Christian Schools International.

Academic Excellence



BCA has a long-standing reputation of providing students with an excellent, rigorous, college preparatory education within the context of a Christian worldview. BCA students traditionally score significantly above district and state levels on annual Advanced Placement Tests and have earned the AP Gold Honor Roll Award since its inception. BCA students have also exhibited strong performances on the PSAT, as well as the SAT and ACT for college admissions. The average class size in the BCA High School is fifteen students per class. There are twenty-four high school faculty and staff members, and over fifty percent hold or are working toward advanced degrees.

Curriculum

The BCA curriculum includes twenty-four honors courses and fourteen Advanced Placement courses, some of which are offered on a rotating schedule, i.e. not every year. Courses are provided on a traditional year-long schedule (seven 50 minute periods per day). The Academy's required courses dictate that a student will be limited to one or two AP courses in the 9th-10th grade years, and typically hit a maximum of nine - ten AP courses over four years. The requirement of a Christian Foundations course each year also limits a student's options for electives, foreign language classes, and additional core classes.

Students have the opportunity to complete third and fourth levels of Spanish through Alamance Community College, and may also enroll in additional college courses through the dual enrollment programs at Alamance Community College, Elon University, and Judson College, when scheduling allows.

Academic Honors: Burlington Christian Academy does not rank students; instead, BCA honors students using a Latin Honors System upon graduation.

In 2025 Burlington Christian Academy had 26 students awarded varying levels of AP Scholar Awards. Several in the class of 2025 also earned noted college scholarships including a Trinity Scholarship at Duke University and a Scott Ellis Merit Award at Campbell University.

BCA has celebrated four *National Merit Scholars* and fourteen *National Merit Commended* students in the sixteen years of the high school.


