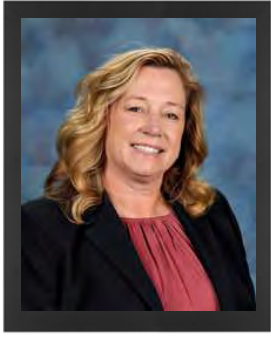

Each student begins by selecting a historical figure from either the past or present and reading an autobiography about that





person's life. Through their reading and research, students gain a deeper understanding of the individual's accomplishments, character, and impact on the world.

Once their research is complete, students take on the challenge of bringing their chosen historical figure to life. They carefully assemble costumes and props that represent significant aspects of their character's life and achievements. Students also write and memorize a speech, which they proudly present to parents, teachers, and fellow students on presentation day.

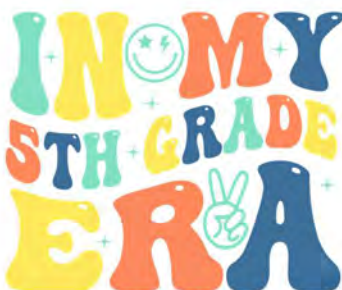

In dance, students explored four styles—lyrical/contemporary, ballet,

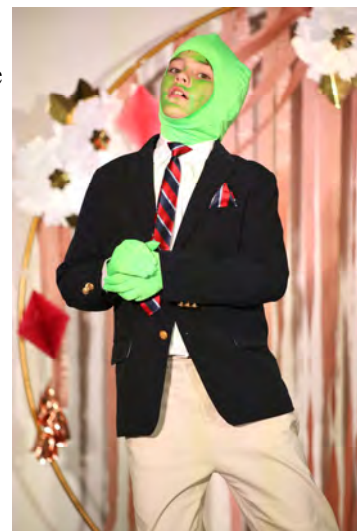
modern, and jazz—while learning the fundamentals of movement,

Learning Languages, Expanding Horizons, Sharing Christ

The Foreign Language program at Burlington Christian Academy provides students with engaging opportunities to learn new languages while growing in their faith and understanding of God's world. Beginning in elementary school, students take active leadership roles in the classroom by leading discussions about the date, weather, and seasons in Spanish, praying together, and practicing conversational skills with their classmates. Through songs, Scripture, and prayer, students learn to praise the Lord in another language, reciting the Lord's Prayer in Spanish and offering prayers of thanksgiving and petition throughout the week.

Language learning at BCA is hands-on and interactive. Students explore cultures through activities such as making Guatemalan alfombras for Holy Week, participating in a salsa-making contest, sampling French cheeses, studying Japanese language and culture, celebrating Spain's La Tomatina festival, and enjoying a chocolate feast while learning about Mesoamerican history. They also use technology, games, and friendly competitions to reinforce vocabulary, geography, and cultural knowledge, including learning the capitals and locations of

Spanish-speaking countries around the world.



High school Spanish students enhance their reading, writing, speaking, and listening skills while exploring the use of language to share the Gospel. Students learn Scripture in Spanish, read Spanish novels, complete cultural projects, and gain real-world experience

through activities such as an all-Spanish scavenger hunt at Plaza Latina and food presentations featuring dishes from Spanish-speaking countries. Students gain confidence and start to recognize the potential of their language skills in missions, ministry, and future careers.



One of the greatest joys of the program is watching students use what they have learned beyond the classroom. Whether serving on mission trips, pursuing language studies in college, or communicating with Spanish speakers in their professions, BCA students are discovering that learning a

language opens doors to serve others and share the love of Christ. With the addition of AP Spanish Language and Culture next year, the Foreign Language program continues to equip students to impact the world for Jesus Christ.

First graders cultivated spinach and carrots while learning what plants need to thrive, connecting their observations to Jesus' parable of
